

chair

At the last Council meeting in May annual elections were made for the main Council officers and I was pleased to be reappointed as chairman. This is the last year of this Council with elections due in May 2011. As Val Bacon had very unfortunately to resign due to ill health, Sue Roberts was appointed as Deputy Chairman. Sue has been a long serving member of the Council and her input as the Deputy Chair will be welcomed.

The new Government has announced that it will promote the radical devolution of power and greater financial autonomy to local government and community groups. A Bill that will shift power from the state to local communities and empower local people formed part of the Queen's Speech.

The new Secretary of State for the Department of Communities and Local Government has recently stated that "This important Bill would shift power from the central state back into the hands of individuals. communities and councils. It will empower local people giving them more power over local government. It will free local government from central and regional control so that they can ensure services are delivered according to local needs". What this will mean in practice at the Parish Council level is not yet clear; wider powers for Parish Councils are to be welcome but this is likely to lead to an even heavier work load for councillors who currently all provide their services on a voluntary basis. We will watch with interest.

One aspect of the above is the abolition of regional spatial strategies and returning decision making powers on housing and planning to local councils, which will include decisions on the amount of new housing within individual local authority areas. This is likely to affect the several planned large housing developments in this area. This Council has been concerned for some time about planned major housing developments near Wantage and Didcot and the impact of

these on the local infrastructure, particularly on traffic and the road network (e.g. A417). It is likely that the new government's plans will require a revision to the District Council's Core Strategy which is commented on elsewhere in this Bulletin. However additional housing is needed in the area and it is not clear at this stage where and when it will be built.

We welcome the Springline Villages Festival from 11th June to 20th June 2010, where the villages of East and West Hendred, Ardington and Lockinge will be holding a week-long Festival. This will give a focus on local villages and provide a vehicle for many societies and organisations to show off their achievements.

Proposed Boundary change

We have known for some time that West Rowstock is expected to become part of East Hendred parish. We have now received a map showing the proposed change. The plan is for all houses north and south of the Wantage Road (A417) west of Rowstock corner to become part of our parish. The change also includes the houses in Tudor Walk. It is understood that the changes will become effective for the parish elections in 2011.

Mrs Val Bacon

The Parish Council is very sorry about Val Bacon's ill health which has resulted in her having to resign from the Council. Val has been a highly effective councillor for seven years and Deputy Chairman for the last three. She had particular interest in the provision of children's activities in the village and led the Council's bid for grant funding from the "Playbuilder" scheme run by the County Council. For many years she managed the very popular courtesy lighting system in the village. Val was also an active member of the team developing the Parish Plan, with a particular interest in the environment. She subsequently became a member of the Environment Group and provided a valuable link between the Parish Council and this group. Val also takes a keen interest in developments in the wider area of the Vale. The Council will greatly miss her thoughtful and valued input to all aspects of Council activity

Co-option of New Councillor.

Following the resignation of Val Bacon from the Council a notice was placed in the village notice board calling for names to justify an election for a new councillor. These were not forthcoming and hence the Council can co-opt a new Councillor. Council's Annual Meeting

Following the Annual Parish meeting held in April the Council's annual meeting in May elected officers and representatives on working groups. John Sharp was re-elected as chairman and Sue Roberts as the Deputy chair. Sue has been a councillor since the early 1990's and one of the longer serving members of the Council. Stephen Wyatt has agreed to join the transport group and will work with Susan Townley on this topic.

Report on Annual Parish Meeting – April 2010

This was held in Snells Hall on April 27th and attended by Parish Councillors, District and County Councillors, our Community Police Support Officer and members of the public.

The Chairman, John Sharp, reported on the Council activities over the last year. He was pleased that East Hendred had been awarded best village in the Vale District in the Calor Village of Year Competition, organised by ORCC. This had been led successfully by Hendred Entertains.

During the year Rachel Sutton had resigned as a councillor and been replaced by Janet Shelley. There had been a welcome representation at Council meetings from the local Neighbourhood Police Unit.

The boardwalk path in Snells had been opened in September by the new Rector. The planning and construction of this had been managed by the Parish Council, with funding from several organisations including the County Council, Parish Council, Hendreds Environment Group, UKAEA Harwell and Thames Water. It was now in good use and much appreciated by those using it to and from school or for leisure purposes.

The Council has had several concerns about funding levels, as reserves had been run down in the last 5 years. A Finance Group had been set up which met before each Council meeting. The precept for 2010/11 had finally been agreed at a sum of £22,000 which was 10% up on the previous year. This covered items such as the village lengthman, clerk and minute secretary's salaries, courtesy lighting, bulletins, insurance and grants to local organisations totalling about £1800.

The Council had commented on 25 planning applications during the year and also been involved in several appeals involving the Cottage (Chapel Square) and Greensands.

Four Bulletins had been produced during the last year and the distribution now includes West Rowstock as well as the village. The village web site was kept up to date and minutes of the Parish Council meetings were now available on it.

The Council had actively been involved in responding to the Vale District Council's draft Local Framework Development, particularly the Core Strategy which will replace the current Local Plan and guide development for the next 20 years. The Council had organised a village meeting to explain the content of the Core Strategy and used the feedback to support its comments to the Vale. In addition the County Council had produced the SCOTS (South Central Oxfordshire Transport Study) which had also been commented on. A particularly disappointing aspect of this study was the lack of concern for future problems on the A 417 resulting from the building of more houses near Wantage. A further consultation on the Core Strategy had taken place in January 2010 with the need to identify more housing sites in the District. A new housing site had been proposed east of Wantage as well as a potential new development on the northern part of the Harwell Campus. The Council had responded on both of these, with serious concerns about the proposed site east of Wantage, due to traffic issues.

The Harwell-Chilton Stakeholder Group had met on four occasions during the year attended by a Council representative. The main interests had been the activities of the new Joint Venture company (Goodman, UKAEA and the Science and Facilities Research Council)), as well as the future of the site in terms of decommissioning timescales.

Contributions were also made by the County and District Councillors and spokespersons for each of the Council's Working Groups. Charles Pappenheim reported on progress with the actions from the Parish Plan published in 2009. Reports were also given on the village schools and from the village organisations which had received grants during the last year.

Harwell

Representatives of local Councils (including East Hendred) have been invited recently to a meeting organised by Goodman (the company in a joint venture with UKAEA) to be kept up to date with plans for development of the Harwell site as land becomes available from de-commissioning. This will include both commercial type premises and residential. In the last Bulletin there was information on a possible development of housing at the north end of the site, to be part of the Vale's District Council's Development Strategy. It is planned that similar meetings will be held quarterly.

On election matters, things went reasonably well, other than the Vale sending out the wrong polling cards (which the printers corrected and resent at their own expense together with a letter of apology), some very unfortunate cases of people being struck off the register, and of course the Acting Returning Officers dress code – the Vale Chief Executive has come in for much well deserved ribbing for the scruffy T shirt he was wearing when announcing the results on national TV!

With National Government wielding the axe we are unfortunately starting to see the effects of some of the Vale's own cuts, and people have been been encountering problems with the new charging regime for planning advice, and also with access to government grants for energy saving home improvements for example. East Hendred Community Centre


Regular Snells Hall users will have noted that the markings defining bays in the main car park have been improved and one has been widened, with an appropriate sign, for use by disabled visitors. The Upper Thames Reservoir

The Parish Council is aware of potential major developments close to its northern boundary with regard to the proposed Upper Thames Reservoir and is monitoring closely its progress.

In this respect, the Vale of White Horse District Council has welcomed Thames Water's announcement that its plans for future water supply have changed: initially it was predicted that a reservoir would be required that could hold 150 million cubic metres by 2021. A reservoir with a capacity of 100 million cubic metres by 2026 is now proposed and plans to build the reservoir will be postponed for five years.

The company said that factors which significantly impact on water supply and demand forecasts, such as the economic downturn and revisions to population forecasts, have played a major part in this change.

Every five years water companies in England and Wales are required to produce a Water Resources Management Plan that outlines how they aim to meet predicted demand for water over the next 25 years (from 2010 to 2035). Thames Water's plan "raises a number of important issues, which will be fully examined at a **public inquiry in June 2010**".

Proofs of Evidence for the public inquiry are due to be published as we go to press (June 2010).

Young People in Hendred

The Parish Council is still seeking ways to promote the involvement of young people in the economic and social framework of the village: as mentioned in the last bulletin, there are many legal and health and safety related issues that need to be addressed before any ideas or policies can be implemented. Investigations and inquiries are on-going.

With regard to the proposed basketball area in Snells, the Parish Council submitted its plans to the District Council Planning Department for their advice. Their response indicates that such a plan "would fail to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of East Hendred Conservation Area and therefore would not be looked on favourably by officers". As a result, the Parish Council is actively investigating some alternative options.

New Waste Collection Arrangements

Your waste collection service is changing from 4th October.

You should have received some information on the new service in the post, unless you have a no junk mail policy. Should this be the case you will need to ring for details on 01235 520202. The village rubbish collection day will change to a Tuesday.

The bins are expected to be delivered towards the end of July on a ten week rolling programme. Some properties in the village have been deemed unsuitable for these bins. If this affects your property you will be informed by letter and will receive bin liners instead.

If you are already in receipt of assisted refuse collection, this service will continue. The elderly or the infirm can be considered for this service by ringing 01235 520202.


The Brown Bin collection will continue, for the annual fee of £34.50, but you will now have to put cardboard in the recycling bin.

Details, including a calendar, will be enclosed in your food waste bin to show which bins will be collected when (Food waste will be weekly with refuse and recycling on alternate weeks)

Please read this information carefully, as it will list what items can be put in which bin. Should the wrong items be put in the incorrect bins a contaminated sticker will be attached and it will be the responsibility of the householder to sort before the bins will be emptied.

Allotments


Due to the warmer weather there has been plenty of activity on the allotments.

Hendreds Pre-school has been busy and is thriving with almost 30 children on the register. At the end of July last year we said goodbye to Sarah Cousins who had been a supervisor for 10 years and welcomed Sarah Woodhouse as a deputy supervisor to Tracy Taylor.

Forest School has been a regular item for over year and we have been well supported by Oxfordshire Forest School Services. The children visit a secure piece of land in Sutton Courtenay which is full of interesting nooks and they have freedom to explore, collect treasures and build rope swings. We are delighted to have also started using the area around the Snells boardwalk where the children discovered a nesting pheasant.

We received an Oxfordshire County Council grant last July which was used to buy ICT equipment including a new computer and laptop. We were also able to buy new chairs, rugs and book corner seating. With the East Hendred Entertains grant we are paying for the coach hire for our annual summer outing and Forest School waterproof clothing for staff. The West Hendred and Ginge Village grant will go towards computer software and Wi-Fi access in the pre-school. We are very grateful for the support from the villages.

We have had successful fundraising events such as our Pumpkin Party, a cake sale to businesses in Ardington and we are very much looking forward to our main event of the year, a **Barn Dance** on Friday 18 June to which you are all welcome.

As always the pre-school has been able to enjoy the many facilities in the village including seeing the lambing, visiting the nativity set in December, the village shop as well as meeting Tony the postmaster. The children made poppy pictures using half apples to print with and visited the war memorial on 11 November. This experience has helped the youngest children in our community to start to understand the significance of Remembrance Day.



And when we are not busy at pre-school or exploring the village, we have had visits from the local police and from the fire service. The police let us try on their helmets and we even went in the back of the police van but the sirens were so noisy, we covered our ears. The fire men told us what to do if you catch fire – 'Stop, Drop, Roll.' The children went in the fire engine and had a go at shooting water from the hose across Snells wood – watering the nettles!
