The Council has been addressing the amount of precept that is required for 2011/12. In this period we will be taking over responsibility for part of Rowstock and the precept will need to reflect this. In addition the Council is aware that very few grants will be available from the District and County Councils and hence the Parish Council has built in a sig-

nificant sum for grants to local organisations.

The Council will, however, need to see evidence with the applications submitted from village organisations that other sources of grants have also been tried, together with evidence of some fund raising . The village precept is used to cover the costs of the lengthman, clerk and finance officer, as well as the costs of courtesy lighting, maintenance of playgrounds, bus shelters and other local amenities.

The County Council is currently consulting on its draft blueprint for transport improvements for the county for the next 20 years. The Parish Council is reviewing this Local Transport Plan and will be responding by the deadline of Jan. 9th 2011. Of particular concern to the Council is the increasing traffic on the A417 and access to it from the village. This problem will be exacerbated if large amounts of new housing are built in Wantage and Grove.

We welcome John Baldwin to the Council, replacing Susan Townley. John is an allotment holder and has agreed to take on responsibility for managing the allotments on behalf of the Council. Since the elections in 2007 there are four new councillors due to resignations. The next election will take place in May 2011. With best wishes for Christmas and 2011. John Sharp

New Counciller

Following the resignation of Susan Townley the Council went through the formal step of placing a notice in the village notice board calling for names to justify an election. None was forthcoming and hence the Council advertised the vacancy. The only applicant was John Baldwin and he was appointed at the November meeting of the Council.

John moved into the village in 2007 and has recently moved into a bungalow on White Road. His background is as an architectural technician but more recently has been working as an IT manager for a local firm. John has an allotment and was helping Susan to manage the allotments prior to being appointed as a Councillor. John has since agreed to take over responsibility for the allotments.

We welcome John as a new Councillor and look forward to working with him.

Rowstock

After many discussions on the proposed change of boundary and as noted in previous Bulletins West Rowstock will be joining the East Hendred parish from April 2011. Part of Rowstock is already in the East Hendred Parish (e.g. Rowstock House). The West Rowstock residents will be able to vote at the East Hendred Council elections next May and their precept will be aggregated into the East Hendred precept next year.

The Parish Council has recently been in discussion with Milton Parish Council to identify the particular responsibilities they currently carry out for the residents of West Rowstock so that these can continue to be provided after the transfer.

This Bulletin is already distributed to all relevant houses in West Rowstock and this will continue. We will also be seeking comments from the residents on their needs once the transfer has taken place.

Batteries and Lightbulbs

With the introduction of the new waste collection service we are no longer allowed to put batteries or light bulbs out for collection on a Tuesday. They should be taken to the tip at Drayton and placed in the appropriate containers. For the elderly in the village who don't have their own transport please take them to the village shop where Martin and Louise will collect them and take them when they go. Our thanks to Martin and Louise for that kind offer.



The letter warns them that their property may be removed from the collection list or that they may be fined. This letter is false and either someone's idea of a joke or a deliberate scam. This matter is being treated very seriously and residents are advised that should they receive such a letter they immediately ring the Vale on 01235 520202.

Voluntary Community First Response

In the last issue of the Hoot a questionnaire was delivered to every household in the village asking for opinions on a First Response Team and First Aid Training. We have had a lot of replies to the questionnaire, and so if you wish to have your say and have not done so as yet, please return your questionnaire to the village shop before the end of December. We then plan to hold a meeting in the village hall in the New Year for all interested parties.

Playgrants

Oxfordshire County Council has advised the Parish Council that grants may be available for two separate activities, which are:



East Hendred Community Centre

We were all very sad to learn of the passing of John Hill, who only recently had celebrated his 90th birthday. John was a stalwart of the village in general and the Community Centre in particular of which he acted as deputy chairman for many years.

Almost from the day he and Nan moved into East Hendred John gave unstinting support to many projects. The well attended and deeply moving funeral service at St.Augustine's illustrated the range of John's involvement with many endeavours including war-time service with the RAF, training and working as a scientist and his dedication to the Scouting Movement and the Church. He will be remembered with affection and missed by many for his approachability and friendship. We extend our sincere condolences to Nan and his extended family.

To move on to routine matters. It is over two years since the last change was made to Hall hire fees. During that period there have been inevitable increases in various costs such as electricity, insurance and materials. There is also the extra 2.5% in VAT rate to be imposed next year. To avoid running at a loss the next financial year the Committee has approved a general increase of 5% to all fees from January 1st 2011. Despite the increasing demands on everyone's incomes it is hoped that regular users will be able to meet the revised monthly payments without undue difficulty.

Message From District Counciller Mike Murray

I know that readers would be disappointed were my message not to include some reference to waste, so I am pleased to note in this edition that the Council's waste partner Verdant has recently hosted none other than Blue Peter's Andy Akinwolere on a day with their recycling crews. His video report following the green bin contents from kerbside collection through a super "MRF" to sorted recyclable materials in bales is gripping viewing and can be enjoyed by typing into a browser http://www.greenstar.co.uk/blue_peter_recycling_collection.aspx

More information on bins that residents may have missed include the news that continuing the use of the old green boxes is entirely permissible for recyclables, however households are encouraged to clearly mark the boxes to indicate that they should be left on the kerb ("please leave" perhaps?) otherwise the boxes themselves may well end up being recycled too. More on Brown (garden waste) bins. Through an exemplary management of public funds over several years, the Vale has contrived to issue brown bins to households without necessarily arranging for the payment of the collection service. Whilst some might argue that this collection service should be included within the rates, it does attract a modest annual charge. As a reflection of the Herculean task required to try to reconcile and collect the back payment from those who are not paying for the service, the Council has resolved to take a different approach, and instead remove the brown bins from households that are not registered as being paid up contributers to the collection scheme. I understand that there will be first a sticker attached to the bin warning of its status, in which case I would urge the household to 'fess up and pay their £34. Even more on bins – it appears that one or more scoundrels have taken it upon themselves to purport to be our esteemed Vale Chief Executive and write to households informing them that their waste collection service is to be discontinued altogether. Should a reader be in receipt of one of these bogus letters, I would urge them to contact the Vale in the first instance.

With apologies again to our excellent County Councillor Iain Brown, I have been informed that the County's roll out of bus stop improvements has been slowed, or perhaps halted, due to budgetary constraints. In particular the bus stop improvements have stopped short of the Didcot bound stop outside the Steventon Bakery (famed for its Lardy Cakes I understand) which whilst confirmed to be included in the list of facilities scheduled for improvement, is delayed due to lack of funds

The Sport of Kings (and Queens)

Horse racing may be centuries old but Racing Stables are not, these developed during the 18th & 19th Centuries. During the 18th Century owners had their racing horses prepared by their grooms with the rest of their horses, this was replaced by having specific and highly sort after 'racing grooms'. Then as owners realised that horses from specific regions were better trained (Berkshire being one of them), it became fashionable to send your racing horses to stables in these regions to be trained, and Racing Stables or Training Yards were established (mid 19th century).

East Hendred was one such place; gallops on the Berkshire chalk downs were some of the best in the country.

We had over a hundred years of horse training in East Hendred until the 1990s when Andy Turnell sold Orchard Stables and they were converted into houses. The Racing Yards in East Hendred brought workers, many of whom settled and stayed. Some famous faces were apprentices here – the late Alex 'Hurricane' Higgins being one of them. Lester Piggott, who was born in Wantage, was a frequent visitor to the Eyston Arms. But who can forget the horses? 'Ki Ming' the 2000 Guineas winner trained by John Beary & latterly his brother Michael. Mr Nice Guy was a favourite with everyone, trained by Eddie Reavey and it was a very memorable day when Maori Venture returned home as the Grand National Winner – in 1987! (You can watch the race on YouTube!)

Many people still miss the strings of horses trailing through the village on their way to the gallops, the sight of which was beautiful whatever the season. If you weren't lucky enough to have lived here when there was racing it really was a sight to behold. The racing yards also had their own community with the stable lads & lasses, Ted Chasney's betting shop, the Jockeys, the Trainers & the Owners all of which is now lost to our village, maybe for the better or maybe not, but it is one of the many changes our village has undergone over the last Millennium or so.

We are putting on an exhibition in Champs Chapel next year on Horse Racing in East Hendred, which ties in with the Oxfordshire Museums Council theme for 2011 of 'Occupations'.



Repairs to St Mary's

In January this year, the Parish commissioned a very experienced architect, John Radice, to carry out a Quinquennial Inspection of the church. This revealed that a considerable amount of renovation was required to bring the church back into a good state of repair. The major element is the roof. The tiles are of good quality and can be reused but the battens on which they sit have rotted away. Replacing them involves stripping the roof, removing the lime plaster between the rafters, replacing the battens, introducing a high-tech waterproof membrane and replacing the tiles. The architect has recommended that every fourth course is drilled and nailed to enable them to be anchored more securely as the roof is very steep and the nibs (protrusions on the back of each tile) are quite shallow. Stuart Huggins, who also repaired the roof of the adjoining St Mary's Cottage, is carrying out the work on the roof.



Work continues on the new roof at St Mary's. This includes replacing the finial right at the top of the steeple.

John's inspection also highlighted a series of other problems. All the asbestos guttering and rainwater goods need to be replaced and the stonework, particularly at the gable ends where the coping stones have allowed water ingress, needs repairing. Lead in stained-glass windows expands as it heats up in the sun, especially on the south side of a church, and doesn't contract; this results in the characteristic bowing of stained-glass windows. Paul Gregory, who has been making and repairing stained-glass windows all his working life, is removing the most badly bowed 'lights' in the church and re-setting them. The last major item is the boundary wall that surrounds the church grounds which is in need of partial replacement and re-pointing.

Following a generous contribution from the East Hendred Catholic Charities Trust, established by Edward Eyston's ancestors, the parish has to find £175,800 to complete the work on St Mary's and the upgrade of facilities in the Catholic church of St Patrick's in East Ilsley (part of the same parish). Each household in the parish is being briefed on the financial requirement and asked to consider a 5-year pledge. So far, with Gift Aid, the pledges total £168,200, 96% of the sum required, leaving £7,600 left to secure. The Diocese of Portsmouth has kindly provided an interest-free loan so that the work can be completed in one go.
