

Planning continues to be an important topic for the Parish Council. One of the important aspects of planning is the shape and form of a village. East Hendred's parish is quite large, encompassing a third of the Harwell site to the south and extending almost to the main western railway line to the north. The core of the village is south of the A417, which is a very busy road and likely to become more so. At present there are 18 houses north of the A417, immediately adjacent to the village. In the 1960's and 1970's there was a community on the Aldfield prefab site(part of the Harwell campus at the time)

which was also in our parish but not connected to village amenities. More recently West Rowstock has joined our parish.

The Vale Council's Interim Housing Supply Policy (IHSP) provided incentives for developers to put forward sites, and five were proposed in our village. At a later stage we heard that four of these would not qualify because they were within the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (the northern edge of which is the A417). The remaining site is for 21 houses north of the A417 between Woods Farm Lane and the houses opposite the White Road turn. As noted elsewhere in this bulletin the IHSP has had to be withdrawn. However this application has now been presented for approval under the normal planning system and the Council is currently looking at its implications. It raises several issues, the most obvious being the busy traffic on the A417 and access to village amenities from the new site if approved.

Another important factor is whether the village should expand north of the A417. If this site is approved this would take the total number of houses north of the A417 to 40 which is more than 10% of the village housing stock. However the village urgently needs more affordable housing and there are few suitable sites within the main body of the village. The proposed development would provide 8 affordable houses. Clearly there is plenty of space for the village to grow northwards but is this what the village wants, as the village would then be divided by the A417? The Parish Plan completed in 2008 did not address the issue raised above. There will be the opportunity to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan in due course which will specifically address land usage (including sites for new housing) which was not part of scope of the original Parish Plan.

We note with regret the death of Maggie Pill in July. Maggie was a Councillor for 16 years and during that time made many important contributions to the Council's work. She will be sadly missed from many aspects of village life.

New Notice Board for Rowstock

The Parish Council received a request for a new Notice Board to replace the existing one close to the houses on the north side of the A417, which is in poor shape. A new board has been built and installed on the wall of the garden to Rowstock House on the south side of the road and close to the bus stop. This has been agreed as a more convenient place for residents to read Council information and other notices.

Electoral Review of the White Horse District Council

A recent review has been undertaken by the Local Government Boundary Commission to consider the number of councillors representing the authority. The aim of the review is also to recommend ward boundaries so that each councillor represents approximately the same number of electors. We understand that East Hendred is likely to be separated from Steventon and Milton (as at present) but with its own District Councillor (there are currently two councillors representing the larger ward).

We are pleased that our finances have benefited greatly from the healthy income that resulted.

Sorry to remind you but Christmas is rapidly approaching so that we are starting to plan for our annual traditional Bazaar which takes place on Saturday, December 1st at Snells Hall. It is being run as usual in conjunction with St.Augustine's and St. Mary's churches. One of the main features of the Bazaar is the Main Draw with over 50 prizes. Regular users will know that the income that results from our fund raising events enables the Management Committee to keep our hiring rates at a very competitive level and to assist in the constant effort to maintain the Hall fabric and facilities at a high level. So please note the date and support this event as far as you are able to.

With reference to the regular repairs and renewals that are inevitable in such well used premises recently it was noticed that the wooden top to the wall in front of the fire pump had decayed since it was installed and was becoming unsightly and dangerous. We would thank Mark Salt for making an excellent job of replacing the wooden section with new material. Mark also has improved the sound and heat insulation of the gallery by installing a barrier at the gable end balustrade. As far as future remedial work is involved we are concerned about the poor state of the main car park and we are intending to institute some necessary repairs in the near future.

We are pleased to report that there is a continued high level of bookings for the Hall which reflects the wide appreciation of the excellent facilities that are available here.


Maggie Pill

Proposal for an additional Intermediate Level waste store at the RSRL Harwell site

An exhibition was held in Snells Hall in July to provide the background to the proposed new storage facility for radioactive waste. There was also an opportunity to talk to experts from RSRL (Research Sites Restoration Ltd). Many villagers and local residents took the opportunity to visit the exhibition. Parish Councillors were also on hand for discussions.

Most of those attending the exhibition accepted the need for a new store which if approved will be in the East Hendred Parish. The transfer of some existing waste to Sellafield was welcomed. However there was concern expressed about bringing waste from outside the county, particularly from Winfrith. It was also noted that the concrete boxes used to store the waste will eventually be moved to the National Geological Disposal Facility, although a site for this has not yet been agreed and it is not expected to be available before 2040.

The planning application for the new store is expected later this year; the Parish Council will respond in depth to this when it is available.

Vale District Council Interim Housing Supply Policy (IHSP)

In the last Bulletin the revised status of this policy was described. The Vale District Council has had to withdraw the IHSP as a result of the issue of the National Planning Framework Policy . As noted in previous Bulletins five applications were made under IHSP for this village. Four were in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and were rejected at an early stage. The remaining application for 22 houses north of the A417 has now been submitted to the Vale District Council as a normal application and is under consideration by the Parish Council. One of the key issues is the busy A417 and how residents from the new site (if approved) would be able to access the village amenities.

A public meeting to discuss this proposal was held in Snells Hall on Sunday Oct. 7th. Useful comments on the application were received from those attending and will be taken into account when the Parish Council prepares its response shortly.

Annual Audit

The Parish Council accounts have to be audited annually, like all Councils. This audit was completed recently and we are pleased to report that the auditors found no issues with this year's accounts. Our Finance Officer, Diana Wheeker prepared the accounts and we thank her for her careful work to ensure the accounts were in good order.

On 2nd September, parishioners at *St Mary's* said their goodbyes to Fr Terence Fitzpatrick, their parish priest since 2009, with a final mass at the church and a farewell parish lunch in the garden of Hendred House (see photo). Parishioners from Coventry and Lambourne, where Fr Terence had previously served as priest, also attended. Fr Terence is retiring. On September 14th we welcomed Fr Andrew Burnham, resident in East Hendred, as our priest.

At St Augustine's, two more in the popular series of *Penney Memorial Lectures* are coming up this autumn. First, on Friday 26th October, Bishop Peter Nott will discuss whether bishops should – or should not – sit in the House of Lords. 

Hendreds Pre-school Update

The Hendreds Pre-school is situated in East Hendred meeting in our own purpose built premises at Snells Hall. We are




very lucky to have such a highly qualified team of staff, led by Fiona Brown, our supervisor who holds the post graduate Early Years Professional Status. Fiona took on the role of supervisor last October and has changed the ethos of the pre-school to be more child-centred and to work with parents to support the children's learning. This change of direction has seen the introduction of independent snack times, working with parents to record the children's 'Learning Journey' (record of achievements) and reorganising the pre-school environment. The staff work passionately in their roles, helping children reach their potential, gain self-confidence and become more independent. The curriculum follows the Early Years Foundation Stage and all four staff members are qualified to teach this. Lindsey Denly, our deputy, has recently achieved a First Class degree and is now a Level 6 practitioner. Much of the curriculum is based around familiar stories

such as 'The Three Little Pigs', 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. Fun songs, woodland walks or delicious baking activities are then developed from these stories. The pre-school has strong links with the village community, and whilst out for a walk to the local shop to buy ingredients for a baking activity, or collecting bugs, it is lovely to see local residents engaging with many of the children they know.

We are fortunate to have a secure garden which the children are able to explore as they wish (no restricted 'playtimes'!) Recently we laid artificial grass which makes the garden usable all year round instead of it turning into a mud pit for various months of the year. The children love playing with sand, water and mud as well as using climbing equipment, the new trampoline and the trikes to ride on.

The pre-school is open for all three and four year old children every day of the week. 


DOWNS GOLDEN AGE
