Jubilee Tree planting

The trees have been planted in the area along the north edge of Coulings Close, adding to the buffer zone of trees between the village and the A417. They are tiny at the moment. 

Parish Council News



In the past many of our major village facilities have benefited from significant grants, including Snells Hall, the Snells walk-way and children's playgrounds. Grants to improve or add to our village facilities are not so easy to find these days, with cutbacks in many areas. Many planning approvals carry with them the opportunity to capture funding contributions for local infrastructure - entitled section 106 agreements. Unfortunately these are not usually available to Parish Councils.

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is now in place through the 2008 Planning Act. Councils will be empowered to set a charge for most developments and this would require a meaningful proportion of receipts to pass to the neighbourhoods where the development that gave rise to them took place. It is expected that some of these receipts can be passed down to Parish Council level which will be a real step forward. However this is not expected until 2014 when the Vale District Council introduces its own Core Strategy document.

It has recently been suggested to the Parish Council that it should start identifying suitable projects that could benefit from such funding. This process was started at our last Council meeting. We would welcome ideas from residents on projects that in the future could benefit from funds associated with planning developments (which could include even quite small ones).

We are advertising again for a Parish Councillor. Unfortunately our last recruit had to withdraw owing to an unanticipated change in her work load. Please consider if you can help the village by becoming a parish councillor. It is an opportunity to work with other councillors for the benefit and improvement of this village. Details of the appli-

cation procedure appear below.

Neighbourhood Policing Update December 2012

Welcome to the latest Wantage East neighbourhood update from Police Community Support Officer C9815 Tim Deane. The Wantage East Neighbourhood Team would like to wish everyone a safe Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

Incidents

Members of the Neighbourhood team were involved in an Operation targeting rogue traders. The Neighbourhood team were involved in locating a vehicle after reports of the driver going door to door collecting scrap metal. The vehicle was located and stopped in Chilton, the driver and passenger were spoken to. They were found not to have business insurance so their vehicle was seized and the driver was dealt with for the offence, also he did not have a waste carriers license so was issued a £300 fine from Vale of White Horse District Council. If you see any suspicious persons or vehicles with scrap metal please report it to the Police we can then stop and check any person and also identify the scrap that could be stolen.

Members of the Neighbourhood team were involved in Remembrance Day Parades and assisted with relevant road closures.

In December the Neighbourhood team will be involved in Operation Merriment - this will involve promoting, delivering and raising awareness of crime prevention and reduction methods to occupants of properties that could help to improve their security.

Christmas drinking

The Christmas season is nearly here and if you are planning to party this year think ahead, stay safe and know your limits. Everyone enjoys a festive night out, but this is one of the busiest times of the year for the emergency services who regularly deal with the fallout from too much Christmas cheer. If you have one too many drinks you are more likely to be a victim of crime or get into dangerous situations - on a typical Friday and Saturday night, up to three quarters of all accident and emergency attendances are alcohol-related. Almost half of all violent crime is alcohol-related, as are 80 per cent of pedestrian deaths on a Friday and Saturday night. One in three reported rapes happens when the victim is drunk. The message from Thames Valley Police this Christmas is simple: **plan ahead, drink sensibly, and look out for one another**.

- Drink sensibly and stay with your friends.
- Plan in advance how you will get home.
- Save the number of a licensed taxi firm in your mobile phone.
- Don't accept drinks from strangers or leave your drink unattended.
- If there's trouble while you're out, stay well clear of it.
- Avoid walking alone through dark or unsafe areas (men as well as women).
- Keep your belongings with you and your valuables out of sight.
- Don't drink and drive, and remember you may still be over the limit the morning after a big night out.

If you drink alcohol or take drugs and drive, you put yourself, your loved ones and other road users at risk. Drink and drug driving is totally unacceptable and is a serious crime.




Proposed Intermediate Level Radioactive Waste Storage facility

In a previous Bulletin we have outlined the preparations that have been made for a planning application for this new Intermediate Waste Store on the Harwell Campus site. These have included a public exhibition that was held in Snells Hall. If approved it will be built in the East Hendred parish.

The formal application has now been made and the Parish Council is reviewing this in the light of comments that were made on the earlier Scoping Document and from those attending the exhibition. In particular it is noted that the application still includes moving waste from the Winfrith site to Harwell for storage. Indeed of the proposed capacity of the store initially 25% of the content will be from the Winfrith site. The Parish Council has been concerned about moving waste onto the Harwell site from outside the county.

The application is available on line at http://myeplanning.oxfordshire.gov.uk reference no. MW.0183/12. The closing date for comments was December 6th this year.

Snells Hall - Victorian school to village hall

One of the guests at this year's Beer Festival asked what happened to the money that was taken from honest citizens attending the festival. Explaining that the profits from the festival went towards hall funds and observing his puzzlement it occurred that many people might like to know how the hall comes to be there and how it runs.

The hall is not owned by any person or organisation, but is held in trust for the village by the trustees of the registered charity East Hendred Community Centre. The trustees, who are elected at the AGM and also representatives of village organisations that use the hall, are answerable to the Charity Commissioners and their duty is to maintain and protect the hall so that it can be used safely by village people and organisations now and in the future. Snells Hall was the old Victorian school and after major modifications in the early 1970's is recognised in the area as having a unique character but still providing very good facilities. The associated Pre-school benefits from being able to use these facilities from time to time. The Hendred Heritage Trust also has storage facilities in the hall and the village fire pump is housed in a special building in the garden.

The hall gets most of its income from the fees that users pay to use it for 400-odd events per year. In fact, the hiring fees pay the operating costs of the hall, and part of the challenge of running the hall lies in raising grants and putting on fund-raising events like the regular Christmas Bazaar and the Beer Festival for capital projects such as the new kitchen and recent toilet refurbishments. We are aware that more money is going to be needed in the near future for repairs to the car park and renovating the hall floor.

There is a lot of administration involved in running the hall. By far the most time-consuming is looking after bookings, but completing the books, keeping inspections and insurance upto-date and maintaining the fabric of the hall all extract their pound of flesh.

Having good wardens is an absolute boon to the hall. Our current wardens come with built-in African drumming lessons; what more could one ask for?

Keeping it all together, which includes keeping the users happy and the rentals for village organisations low, is quite a challenge. If you might enjoy it, come and join us – see www.hendred.org for contact details.

Church news

Towards the end of last winter, the condition of the Church perimeter wall began to show signs of distress, so advice was sought on whether it might collapse. The section of wall near to the main gate was of a significantly older construction than the remainder; it was merely built on clay and contained no foundations. This, combined with the height of soil behind the wall, had led to its failing condition.

We were reassured that the wall was not in imminent danger of collapse, but decided to begin the process to obtain quotes and Diocesan approval to have a 15 metre length demolished. The plan was to remove all the existing stones, and construct reinforced foundations and a retaining wall. The original stones were then to be used to re-face the wall – thus producing a like-forlike reconstruction.

Chris Miles, our Church Treasurer, applied for and obtained grants from East Hendred Entertains and the Parish Council,

and then identified another source of funding. As the Church is within the North Wessex Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, we qualified for a grant from the North Wessex Downs LEADER Programme, which would amount to 75% of the cost.

The work was carried out by local builders (Campbells of Wantage) in April to July of this year, and resulted in a superb repair which has enhanced the Church entrance, and should last for many years to come.

When cleaning the old stones to use them again, the builders discovered a fine carved face hidden at the foot of the wall, lying on its side. They built it in to the new wall for all to see.



Wood for Fuel

Burning wood to heat your home, and maybe to heat your water too, can be more environmentally friendly than some of the alternatives.

The environmental advantages of using wood fuel decrease the further the wood has to travel. So aim to get your wood locally: from your community woodland or local woodland owners: look in shop windows or notice boards, or try <u>www.sylva.org.uk/myforest/</u> www.woodfueldirectory.org and www.coppice-products.co.uk. Local wood fuel suppliers can register with these websites so that people can more easily find their local suppliers.

Unless stated otherwise, wood from garage forecourts or supermarkets is unlikely to be local. Kiln dried wood has been – as the name implies – heated up to drive off water. This heating process uses energy, and also reduces the environmental advantage of burning wood.


