
The day raised an outstanding £2,626.80 with gift aid yet to claim. The money will help to ensure the preservation of our village's history by safeguarding the much loved Museum.

Blue Plaque Unveiled for Lord Penney

On Friday August 8th a blue plaque was unveiled on Orchard House in Cat Street (now owned by Dair and Vicki Farrar-Hockley) to commemorate the life of Lord Penney who lived there in East Hendred from 1963 to his death in 1991. He became Baron Penney of East Hendred in 1967. The plaque was initiated by the Parish Council; it is the first blue plaque in the village and one of only 9 in the Vale District. Lord Penney was a physicist who had a leading role in the development of Britain's nuclear programme, was Chairman of the UK Atomic Energy Authority from 1962 to 1967, and became Rector of Imperial College, London. A laboratory at Imperial has been named after him. He took part in village affairs being a Trustee of the newly formed Community Centre Committee and sometime President of the Sports Club.

Lady Penney was an active church-goer, member of the Parochial Church Council and President of the Playgroup. She gave a generous donation to the village to establish a children's playground in memory of her husband; the Penney Playpark was opened by Lady Penney herself in October 2000 as part of the village's Millennium celebrations. She said at the time that "Bill loved children and always found them much easier company than their elders". She also planted a tree in the playground.

Dr. John Sharp (Chair of the Parish Council) welcomed guests to the occasion. Professor Cowley, currently the CEO of the UK Atomic Energy Authority, spoke of the many achievements of Lord Penney during his lifetime. After the unveiling of the plaque by Christopher Penney (his son) the Farrar-Hockleys hosted a reception in their garden for all those present providing opportunities for the exchange of reminiscences about the Penneys' time in East Hendred.

In the last *Bulletin* I spoke of the diminishing role of Parish Councils in being able to manage the key issues that affect their community, particularly planning. We now have a development of 21 houses north of the A417 although the Council objected; a planning application for an additional four houses to this site is being progressed. We understand that further houses north of the A417 are being planned, as explained in a separate article. One of our main concerns is the pedestrian crossing which will enable residents to cross the busy road to access all the village facilities and buses. We are grateful for support from the village to press for a safer crossing and we still hope that can be achieved.

Several villages are developing a Neighbourhood Plan which when approved is a document that planners have to take into account in their decision making. Extensive work is required to develop such a plan but we are increasingly of the view that it may be worthwhile if it gives us more control of the village. Unfortunately such a plan cannot be progressed until the Vale District Council have their own

Local Plan in place, and this is not expected to be before next year at the earliest.

The unveiling of a blue plaque to Lord Penney was a notable achievement in the last month. The Penneys made a considerable contribution to the village when they lived in Cat Street and we have the Penney Playpark to remember them by.

The Pendon Museum celebrated its 60th anniversary recently and several villagers were invited to the event. The model railway features several village properties in miniature, including Snells Hall, the village shop and Champs Chapel. It is an attraction well worth visiting.

Snells Hall is 40 years old this year and there will be a celebration of the event at the Summer Fayrewell, to be held at Snells Hall on Saturday 13th September. The Hall was previously the village school, opened in 1862 and in the early 1970's it together with the headmaster's house was bought for the village to convert into a hall for the princely sum of £7700. Several grants were available but a massive fund raising programme was set up to raise £85,000 (in current money) to pay for purchase of the hall and its conversion. The hall has served the village well for the last four decades.

Houses North of Reading Road -A417 – Improved Road Crossing Needed

The development currently being built by Pye Homes comprises 21 houses. A further planning application for four houses on the garden of Lynwood has been made and members of the Parish Council have been shown plans for 26 more houses that Pye Homes want to build behind the 21 currently under construction.

Planning permission, which was opposed by the parish council and the Vale of White Horse District Council, would not normally have been granted for any of these houses. Because there is not currently a Local Plan in place for the Vale that provides enough building land to meet government targets, planning permission was granted by the government's planning inspector on appeal for the first 21 houses. This is a situation that is being repeated all over the country.

Any residents of the new houses who wish to use the shop, sports ground, pubs, schools, churches,

village hall or play parks will need to cross the A417, so a pedestrian crossing has to be provided. The crossing being proposed is uncontrolled - that is, pedestrians have no priority over vehicles, and need to wait for the road to be clear before crossing. Because of the width of the road, the crossing includes a central island refuge for pedestrians. The proposed pedestrian island is narrow (1.5 metres) and so are the carriageways either side (3.3 metres each). Standing on the island, particularly with a push chair or bicycle, with large vehicles going by in front and behind at a legal 40mph is a very dangerous prospect.

For this reason, the Parish Council is doing everything it can to have a pedestrian crossing with a traffic light (such as a Pelican crossing) installed, rather than an uncontrolled island crossing. Village residents were asked for their support for a controlled crossing, and out of 142 respondents, 140 were in favour. Thank you for your support!

The Council is in contact with Oxfordshire Highways, the Vale of White Horse DC, Pye Homes and their planning consultants and architects, our County Councillor, Stewart Lilly and our MP, Ed Vaizey in the effort to have a safer crossing installed.

There is a huge demand for housing and everyone involved in the planning process needs to be prepared to compromise for progress to be made, but in a case like this, where safety is concerned and can be achieved at reasonable cost, the Parish Council will do everything in its power to have a safe crossing installed.

Proposed Bus Stops

Together with the pedestrian crossing, a pair of bus stops has been proposed for the A417 near the new housing development. The Parish Council believes that if bus stops are installed on the A417, buses would soon cease to come into the village, with the result that the distance to the bus stops would increase for almost everyone in the village, and they would have to cross the A417 to access eastbound buses. Out of 140 residents responding to the question of whether bus stops should be installed. 124 said they should not. The Parish Council is opposing the installation of these bus stops.

Snells Hall

Thanks to a generous anonymous donation we have been able to add to our stock of new upholstered folding steel framed chairs and now have 152 of these, which should be adequate for most events that are envisaged to take place in Snells Hall. This means that some of the older blue plastic and steel stackable chairs are available to any organisation or person who would like a few of them. Please email charles@hendred.org for information.

Frank Aldridge has begun stripping and painting the window frames. This effort has exposed the bottom frames which are badly rotted and in three instances need replacing. This is being done but obviously will add to the expense of maintaining premises that are over 150 years old.

The Pre-School is building new toilet facilities and a conservatory/porch extension at the rear of the building. This will improve their facilities and provide access which is independent of the hall Foyer.

The Carpet Bowls Club was formed in 1980 and has continued to operate successfully since then. However, the current membership is no longer able to sustain the Club which has ceased to function and ultimately will have to dispose of two sets of short mats and woods. East Hendred Heritage Trust Matthew William Webb, 1851 - 1924

The great grandson of Matthew William Webb, the artist whose works can be found in London's William Morris Gallery, has recently contacted the Heritage Trust having discovered the address of Downside, Newbury Road, East Hendred on the back of a painting by his great grandfather.


Champs Chapel currently holds a painting of a wagon in Newbury Road thought to be by Matthew William Webb. The artist spent time at Downside, most likely staying with T. F. M. Sheard. He was a member of the Pre-Raphaelite movement and was, at one time, assistant to another renowned artist, Sir Edward Burne-Jones.

Webb's great grandson, Peter Shore, lives in Sweden and pays regular visits to England. On Sunday 3rd August, Peter came to Hendred to see the painting, *The Berkshire Wagon*, thought to be the work of his great grandfather. The painting was previously unknown to him but having seen it, he agreed that it is very much in his great grandfather's style and Peter believe the painting to be genuine.

Peter have given East Hendred Heritage Trust photocopies of two paintings of East Hendred by Matthew William Webb. Both paintings are currently possessed by Peter. One shows a view of Newbury Road by Moonlight and the other depicts a view of Hunts Farm. Both

paintings date from the early years of the last century and give us a glimpse of how Hendred was then.

The original painting and the two photocopies can be seen in Champs Chapel Museum.

Springline Productions - 'Lest We Forget'

On Sunday 3rd August Springline Productions and East Hendred Heritage Trust held an Event to commemorate the start of the Great War in front of the War Memorial and Museum in East Hendred.

Watched by nearly 200 people it was an hour of poems, songs and readings that took the audience through a journey from the frivolous and excited anticipation when the War first started and men went happily to fight, ending with the despair at the lives lost and a world changed for ever. Much of the narrative between the items referred to East Hendred, highlighting life at the time and that 212 men went to fight with 27 who did not return.

The performance started with a rousing patriotic poem 'Who's for the game?' by Jessie Pope performed by Chris Bedford and a recruiting song 'I'll Make a Man out of you' performed by Jill Broadley and Jennie Cosgrave, followed by a lilting rendition of 'Keep the Home Fires Burning' by Eliza England. Some group singing rounded off the lighter part of the performance.

After this the contributions became more sombre, 'In Flanders Fields' read by David Hunter followed by 'I have a Rendezvous with Death' read by Roger Turnbull. Susie Turnbull then read an Extract from 'All Quiet on the Western Front' and then a haunting rendition of the Song 'The Green Fields of France' sung by Clare Bedford.




The August Summer Party was held at West Hendred village hall. A delightful evening was enjoyed with wine and delicious food prepared by members.

Planning Matters

P13/V1987/DA Greensands use of a container as a dwelling.

Enforcement notifications were issued and an appeal against them was lodged. The appeal has been granted.

P13/V2544/FUL - Land north of the Reading Road, Solar Farm

The Parish Council did not object, but have raised a number of concerns. These include the size of the proposed site, changes to surrounding footpaths, the fact that there are already other solar farms nearby and access to the site itself. Additionally they have also requested that an Environmental Impact Assessment is carried out prior to any decision being made.

Planning permission refused and a resubmission of plans was received by the Vale

(P14/V839/FUL). The resubmitted plans were withdrawn on 26th June before a decision was made.

P14/V0717/HH - 63a Coulings Close

Two storey extension to provide increased kitchen and bedroom facilities

The Parish Council had no strong views.

Planning permission granted.

P14/V0923/LB - Blue Plague on Orchard House. Cat Street

Erection of a blue plaque to the front of the building to commemorate William Penney

The Parish Council has no objection.

Application granted.

P14/1222/HH - 1 White Road. Extension to the front elevation to create a shower room and new entrance hall. The Parish Council had no objection. Planning permission granted.

P14/1250/FUL - Moonshine Barn, Aldfield Farm. Conversion to provide workshop/studio. The Parish Council had no strong views but raised concern about impact extra traffic to the site would have for cyclists, as this is part of Sustrans route 544. Planning permission granted.

P14/V1269/HH - East View, St Mary's. Two storey side extension. The application was revised on 1st August to include dormer windows in the extension. The Parish Council objected to this application on the grounds that no provision for on-site parking had been made.

P14/1515/FUL - Curie Avenue, Harwell. Drilling of 5 boreholes. The Parish Council is still considering this application.

P14/1632/FUL - Hill Farm, St Mary's Road. Replacement of general purpose storage building. The Parish Council is still considering this application.

P14/1626/FUL - Land to the rear of Lynwood, Reading Room, Erection of 4 detached houses. The Parish Council objected to this application primarily because there is no safe pedestrian crossing being planned for the A417.

P14/1676/HH and P14/1677/LB - Wells Head, Newbury Road. Structural repairs, improved vehicular access and the removal of trees. The application is for planning permission and listed building consent. The Parish Council objected to this application because it includes replacing the ramped access to the high level footpath with steps, reducing disabled accessibility.
