Steered by our fearless leader Jo (with her never-ending energy) and accompanied by the extraordinary musical genius of Matt Winkworth, it quickly became clear that I was also amidst some significant talent. I gave that audition everything I had and checked my emails every day to see if I'd landed a part. Thus began four months of fun.

With roles assigned and scripts in hand, we didn't mess about – bi-weekly rehearsals were approached with a reassuring professionalism and when the tea break rolled around, you felt as though you'd earned a biscuit and a chat. It can sometimes be difficult to join a well-established group, and it was obvious that this tight-knit team knew one another very well. When you spend so many hours together, especially in the confines of back stage, it's hard not to become close. I enjoyed the references to performances past, all of which were explained in detail to me, the newbie, so that I too might join in on the merriment. I soon felt like one of the family – hopefully I'll

have some references of my own to make in productions to come!

It's an odd thing, getting to know people as they play characters. In some cases, the real and the imaginary coincide – for example, I'll always have a fairy-godmother now, with knowledge and advice from the village and from life. I've also made a friend of the Alderman's daughter (not to mention the venerable Alderman himself) and the Mayor, no less, and feel closer to the heart of the village as a result.

Somehow, I've ended up in numerous other groups and committees, and I'm extremely grateful for the opportunities afforded to me by this proactive and engaging team.

As the performances came into view, other wonderful talents came out of the woodwork (pun intended). I've never seen such an amazing set construction and design in such a small space – it was truly inspired and impressively executed.

Helping out at the deconstruction after the show, I was amazed at the number of handy people with drills and saws and trucks, all willing to chip in to make the show the spectacle it was.

If haven't mentioned some aspect of the show here or some person involved, it is not a reflection of any shortcomings. Every single person involved in the creation and delivery of *Dick Whittington* brought something truly special to the mix, and everyone with whom I came into contact made me feel right at home. I'd like to thank you all, and congratulate you on your achievement!

In short, the Springline cast and crew are an amazing, welcoming and inspiring bunch, and I'd urge anyone looking for some fun to bring whatever creativity they may possess and lend it to this multitalented group. You'll be rewarded, I promise – with friendship and pride.

February is generally a depressing month but the snowdrops are out as an indication of Spring to follow. A good display is on the high bank almost opposite Champs Chapel.

The village has recently suffered many problems and delays with the road works at the White Road/A417 junction. The Council has attempted to put pressure on the developer to keep the road cleaner and to finish the works as soon as possible. However it is likely to be well into March before the road works associated with the Pye 3 site are finished.

Planning continues to be an issue for the Council with several applications per month, several of which (Pye 3, the Lynch) taking considerable time for responses to be prepared. The article below highlights the continuing

planning issues affecting the village. The Local Plan part 2 is awaiting an inspector's evaluation which is expected to occur in June/July. The main issue affecting this village is the proposal to build 1000 houses on the Harwell Campus, of which half could be in this parish. If these are approved, given the distance from the village the impact on the village itself is likely to be small.

The Harwell Campus is developing with significant growth planned over the coming years, as increasing parts of the site are decommissioned. New businesses are being established and new buildings erected. One of the benefits to this village will be facilities such as cafes and more sports becoming available, which will be accessible to local people. Our Parish Council meets regularly with the development company to keep track of progress.

This is the second *Bulletin* to be prepared by our new editor (Rachel Sutton) and we are grateful to her for taking on this task.

# **Planning Update**

As noted in the last *Bulletin*, Pye Homes' application failed to get approval for its proposal to meet condition 8 associated with the planning permission granted for the Pye 3 development (being built now). Pye applied to remove the planned bus stops opposite the Pye 3 development, change the originally approved Toucan type crossing (allowing mounted cyclists and pedestrians to cross) to a Puffin type (pedestrians only) and to approve a footway (rather than cycle- and footway) connecting the crossing to White Road on the south side. The safety of the limited-width footway, particularly for children, was a key factor in the Vale DC Planning Committee's rejection of the proposal.

A new application has been made to remove the bus stops and change the type of crossing as before, but it omits the footway on the south side on the apparent basis that it has already been approved in the original planning permission. We dispute this as the original approval was for a combined footway/cycle way which an Oxfordshire County Council Highways audit stated was unsafe. At the time of writing the Parish Council has requested that this new application is considered by the Vale Planning Committee. The Parish Council will object as before mainly on the basis that OCC Highways has not considered in their safety audit the new combination of bus stops opposite Portway Close, the revised crossing and the narrowness of the footway.

Meanwhile as you will all have noticed Pye Homes have been busy with roadworks which have required traffic lights for a long period, causing disruption to village residents. Several complaints have been made to Pye Homes on the length of the disruption as well as mud on the road. There has been some improvement, but it remains an inconvenience. Permission has been granted for these roadworks until 16th March.

The Vale Local Plan Part 2 continues to be developed. In the last *Bulletin* the plan to build 1000 houses on the Harwell Campus site as part of the Plan was noted. The Vale DC have recently employed a landscape company to prepare a Sustainability Development Plan for the Harwell site and two councillors have met with the team to outline the Parish Council's requirements regarding the scope of the Plan. This Plan will be part of the Vale DC's presentation to the Planning Inspector when he/she reviews Part 2 of the Local Plan, expected to start in June/July this year. We shall press for good landscaping and screening for any developments that impinge on the Icknield Way and the AONB.

The Parish Council has been considering the preparation of a neighbourhood plan for the village, as many local villages have done. It is recognised that it will require a significant amount of work but would have the big advantage that once approved it counts as formal document that has to be taken into account in deciding any planning applications or appeals.

# Village small businesses - sharing experience of working locally?

Several local villages have regular meetings to provide an opportunity for local businesses (particularly small companies or "one-man bands") to meet up and share experience and knowledge. Would you like to discuss setting up this type of meeting in East Hendred?

Meetings could be held monthly with coffee or lunch to share expertise, both technical and on subjects like IT, insurance, tax, premises, finding staff, etc.






Pictured is the winning patrol with their construction of a self supporting structure that was as tall as possible from a fixed number of marshmallows and dry spaghetti.



# The Green Column - Insectageddon

'Insectageddon', or Insect Armageddon, was the headline following the publication of German research that found a dramatic reduction (75%) in the amount of insects measured at test sites over the last 27 years. This is worrying news indeed for anyone concerned about the health of our environment. So worrying, that it's a bit tempting to throw up our arms and say 'we're all doomed'! However, helping insects is something everyone with even the tiniest bit of outdoor space can do by creating some insect friendly habitats.

Insects need food and shelter. You can help to provide food by growing a range of flowering plants that will flower throughout the season. This is highly desirable for human pleasure too. A lot of seed packets now say 'Bee Friendly' on flowers which are good sources of nectar. Many herbs are attractive to insects, as are foxgloves, daphne, ivy, poppies, alliums and buddleia to name but a few. Should you happen to grow nettles (I do, every year without fail despite never having planted them) you can take comfort from the fact that comma, small tortoiseshell, red admiral and painted lady caterpillars all eat nettles.

To provide shelter for insects leave the hollow stems of dead herbaceous plants to stand until spring for overwintering adult insects and larvae. Piles of sticks or leaves or logs also provide good shelter for hibernation and breeding.

Hollow canes and stems packed in a 'bug box' can also make good sites for cavity nesting bees. See a sample pictured below.

#### **Bowling Alley Allotment Association**

The early months of the year see the allotments looking at their least inspiring. The winter greens are still cropping, but beginning to look a little wind blown, and spring planting and summer harvest feel some way off. However, these months are arguably the most important of the gardening year. Fruit and currant bushes have already been pruned and mulched, strawberry beds thinned and it's time to plan for the year ahead. Early season crops, including broad beans, onions, shallots and garlic readily weather the cold and will quickly find their feet outside. Potatoes can be placed to chit, and a sowing of leeks, tomatoes, lettuce, peas and summer cabbage under cover will help to kick start the year ahead.

A reminder – you don't have to be an allotment holder to join BAAA and access the benefits of belonging to both the local and National Allotment Society, including the seed scheme and an invite to talks and other events planned for the year ahead.
