A New Bike Route to Wantage is On The Way

Currently if you want to cycle to Wantage there are a couple of options. You can cycle down the A417, but not many people find this appealing because of the traffic. You can use regional route 544 which links Didcot to Wantage via Harwell Campus. This provides a very attractive, quiet route, but it's a bit of a long way round. From East Hendred (and aiming to end up going west to Wantage) you must first cycle south for one-and-a-half miles to pick up the Ginge Farm track.

Science Vale funding for cycle routes in the area means that a more direct route could be created. Oxfordshire County Council are working closely with landowners to develop a route via Icknield Way and Ardington as shown on the map below.





Considerable efforts were made to try and take the route via East and West Hendred, but key land was not available. This plan will involve crossing Ginge Brook at a spot that locals will know is steep and tricky. A solution here must be suitable for pedestrians, horse-riders and cyclists. It's not fixed yet, but may look something like the picture above right.

Route 544 to Didcot from East Hendred will remain unchanged. It follows Icknield Way past Harwell Campus to Hagbourne Hill, then goes by road to Upton. Upton to Didcot uses the disused railway line. Again, it's not the most direct route to Didcot, but the railway line is a particular pleasure to ride and connects well to Didcot Parkway with an off-road cycle lane via Hitchcock Way. Harwell Campus: The beating heart of the UK's science and tech community.

Known as the science and innovation hub of the UK and referenced regularly in ministerial speeches as a 'national asset', Harwell Campus has moved well beyond the secret days of atomic research in the 50s and 60s to being the jewel in the crown of the UK's science and technology sectors.

The thriving community working on the Campus is now up to 6,000 people in about 250 public, private and academic organisations. With core areas of work focused on Space, Health and Energy, underpinned by major technology groups working in Big Data, Super Computing and Artificial Intelligence, the pioneering research and innovative technologies emerging from Harwell will touch all of our lives at some point.

More locally, the Campus provides job opportunities, work experience placements and is actively involved with schools throughout the region, encouraging young people to consider careers within the science and technology sectors. Focusing on our Campus and surrounding villages, the recently launched Harwell Hub (www.harwellhub.com) aims to be a one-stop shop for jobs, events, campus updates and accommodation. In its short life to date, the Hub has received details of over 60

science and technology related jobs, tangible evidence of the growth of the organisations on campus and their need for skilled people. One reason for creating the Hub was to connect people on the Campus, or our visitors, to local accommodation and amenities. With that in mind local suppliers, be they pubs, cafes, B&Bs or hotels are all welcome to upload information to the Hub.

Two super new additions to the Campus are Pierreponts Café and the Fitness Experts. With a sister branch located in Goring, Pierreponts is not limited to Campus people so if you want a local option for seasonal hot and cold dishes to eat in or take away and delicious coffee, the café is open between 8.00 and 17.00 Monday to Friday. The gym next door run by The Fitness Experts offers Personal Trainer led group training sessions. A choice of over 60 classes is available each week from bootcamp to strength training, box-fit and recovery sessions, as well as over 20 hours of open gym slots for members.

Snells Hall Millennium Extension

This March the hall's Millennium extension was 20 years old. Opened on 6th March 1999 by Lord Jenkins, who lived in the village, with the help of Millennium Project funding as well as funding from the Rural Development Commission, the Vale of White Horse District Council and the Parish Council, the project was successfully completed. In addition to the direct funding, several local guarantors made available considerable immediate funding for the project. Many individuals also gave a great deal of their valuable personal time towards its success. The new extension was designed by Bogdan Nedelkoff who lives in the village and it was awarded a Design Award from the Vale of White Horse District Council. The judges' comments were "Interaction and well thought out additions to an attractive hall of some architectural merit.

Good use of materials and a very functional design, both internally and externally. A commendable effort by all who were involved, particularly the volunteers who laid the entrance floor".

The extension links the Pre-school room which had been opened a year earlier with the main hall. The Gallery was created from a previous school classroom, and a small room was added at the top of the new stairs.

The chimes of the old school bell were heard once again to open the extension, the first time to ring out since the last war. Stan Francis had the honour of ringing the bell – a task he had done when at the village school several decades earlier.

There are plaques in the hall commemorating the formal opening by Lord Jenkins and the sources of funding for the project (particularly from the Millennium Commission).

There were eight applications for nine posts at the recent East Hendred Parish Council election and hence there was no formal election. The eight councillors are the same as those on the previous Council. One vacancy remains and we would be pleased to hear from anyone interested in joining the Council; one requirement is that the candidate has to have lived or worked in the village for at least a year. Many other local Parish Councils also had fewer candidates than the required number.

We note the change in the political status of the Vale District Council as a result of the recent election, losing its Conservative leadership; it will be interesting to see what the implications of this will be. Our District Councillor (Mike Murray) resigned and Janet Shelley has been elected to represent the Hendreds. She lives in East Hendred and was a Parish Councillor some time ago; we look forward to working with Janet.

Planning remains a topic requiring the Parish Council to put in considerable work as the reserved matters for the 65 houses planned for the Greensands site are currently under discussion. A separate article in this *Bulletin* lists the many issues that we have raised with the District Council. We are hoping to work positively with the developers and have already had one meeting with them.

The Morland Bowling Club is under threat as the Plough Inn site is up for sale. The Council, recognising the local benefit of the club, has decided to apply for the green and club-house to be designated as an "asset of community value" and we are working with the Bowls club to achieve this. This would, however, only provide a temporary limit to a potential sale. A separate article in this *Bulletin* outlines the benefits of the club and its forthcoming open days. We hope many villagers will take advantage of these. The Council has also been approached to apply for similar status for The Plough but with two active other public houses in the village we have been advised that this would be difficult. The Plough is a Grade 2 listed building, as is the building used as the bowls club clubhouse, and it will be interesting to see what plans develop for their future.

The Council is taking a keen interest in the proposed plans for the Steventon reservoir as Thames Water continue to develop their plans. If eventually built the southern end would be very close to our northern parish boundary. It is now considerably larger than the plan which was proposed several years ago. We are working with GARD (Group Against Reservoir Development). One key issue is water leakage and it is claimed that if Thames Water reduced its leakage over the whole of its supply area the case for the reservoir would be much weaker. Oxfordshire County Council is seeking an independent enquiry which the Parish Council strongly supports.

Congratulations to the organisers of the Big Hendred Bank Holiday Bash on another successful event.

Planning Update

The main issue for the Parish Council is the development of the Greensands site by Mears. An appeal held in 2017 approved 65 houses on the Greensands site together with 10 dwellings for older people on the Mather House site. The current planning application is to approve reserved matters for the 65 houses on the Greensands site. We have queried the status of the 10 dwellings for older people on the Mather House site, given that an alternative application has been made for this site to develop 10 units of holiday accommodation. The Council was in support of the dwellings for older people as they would meet a local need.

The Parish Council met to discuss the reserved matters application in mid-April and developed a set of comments which were sent to the Vale District Council. Two councillors have also met with the Case Officer. The Council has also had a meeting with developer and their architects. The main points of the Parish Council comments are:

- The application should be reviewed to ensure that it conforms to the Vale Design Guide, and Core Policy 37, with particular focus on issues such as existing movement corridors, encouragement of or walking and cycling, screening and light pollution (site abuts the AONB).
- The quality of house-types being proposed is generally inferior to those in the adjacent Pye developments.
 There is a lack in variety of house-types and little variety of materials is proposed. These house-types proposed are standard units and not developed with the local

- vernacular in mind. Improvements to the design are requested including varying house types, materials more in keeping with the local vernacular, and more landscaping/planting.
- The Council requests that improvements be made to vehicular connectivity through the site. Concern has been made about all the vehicular traffic from the site using Featherbed Lane, particularly as there is some doubt whether the proposed roundabout at the junction with the A417 will be built. Over 100 extra cars using Featherbed Lane, many of them wanting to join the A417, may have to use the existing junction which has several safety issues and has been the site of accidents in the past.
- The Council also requests that shared-use footpaths are connected to the indicated road access, to the adjacent Portway development, to the village and to the byway opposite Featherbed Lane. The footpath also needs to be a shared-use path, to include cycling.
- houses have already been built north of the A417 without any play equipment for youngsters. There is a requirement at the Greensands site for a LEAP (Local Equipped Area for Play) and we are asking that this is well equipped. In addition, we are asking for a recreational area to be provided at the north of the site to benefit both the new residents on this site as well as those in Portway, Ludbridge and Ridgeway Closes. East Hendred Parish Council has stated that it would be very interested to work with the developer to achieve these recreational areas.

The Green Column

New Tree for Snells Wood

Hendreds Environment Group planted a new tree in Snells Wood in March, a native small-leaved lime (*tilia cordata*) pictured with Sarah. A work party in January cleared the patch of ground alongside the Penney Playpark kick-around, tackling some major brambles. We chose to plant a small-leaved lime here, because it may replace some habitat functions of ash. Ash trees are expected to be badly affected by ash dieback in the future. East Hendred has plenty of common lime trees, but we aren't aware of any small-leaved limes (though they may be out there somewhere).

Do take a walk through Snells Wood to see the new tree. The woodland is lovely at the moment, still full of wild garlic as I write, though that will be coming to an end soon. Other trees in the wood and close to the boardwalk include sycamores, aspens, hazels and willows.

Hendreds Environment Group is a community group working to help the local and the global environment. We run practical conservation work parties and campaign on wider issues and we are part of the Oxfordshire Community Action Groups Network. One of the downsides of a village church is the lack of spare seating capacity so we shall ask our normal 9.30am congregation to move swiftly on to make room for the children, their families and friends at 11.

Corpus Christi is not our next highlight. Before that we have Ascension Day – thankfully now restored to its proper Thursday date, 40 days after Easter. This year that will be 30th May. Then, on Sunday 9th June, it will be Pentecost, which, as the word suggests, is 50 days after Easter. Our modern world, gradually more secular, has forgotten that Ascension Day is as important as Christmas Day – what comes down must go up! – and that both days rank with Easter and Pentecost (Whitsun) as the four

great celebrations of the Christian Year. We lost the Whitsuntide Bank Holiday years ago. Instead, the government has given us two Bank Holidays, one at either end of May, both of which offer unreliable weather. (At least Easter and Whitsun, being moveable feasts, gave us two sporting chances of fine Bank Holiday weather).

I have noticed that, as well as always talking about the weather, we nowadays always seem to talk about politics too. Perhaps there is a golden and sunny future when nations will trade fairly and peacefully with one another, to the increased well-being of humankind and the safeguarding of the natural environment. You don't have to espouse the Whig view of history to embrace optimism about such developments. Older and more reliable is the Judaeo-Christian tradition, which has taught us to love one another and to work and to pray for the coming of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. So far, it's been hard going and it's not prelates and priests who manage progress. It's the daily growth in decency of human beings who, in villages like ours and in well-functioning communities throughout the world, do their best for their families, and their friends, and one another.

May God richly bless you.

Work has started in earnest with garlic, onions, potatoes and shallots planted out as well as a range of seeds and plants such as carrots, parsnips, broad beans, peas and brassicas being sown. Bean trenches have been dug and sticks put up, seed beds prepared and compost turned. Rhubarb is cropping, along with asparagus.

Greenhouses (and windowsills) are full of tender seedlings - French and runner beans, courgettes, squash, sweetcorn, tomatoes, herbs and many other delights - as we anticipate those balmy days ahead and the joys of our summer harvests.

After much effort and support, 5 new raised beds have been created on the "village plot".
