The planned visit from our friends in Sarceaux this July has been postponed until next year. We plan to start our social activities when the lockdown has been lifted.

Planning Update

The discussion is still continuing on the reserved matters relating to style and lay-out etc for the Greensands development of 65 houses. Several members of the Parish Council had a positive online meeting with representatives from Mears and Sovereign Housing (the joint developers). It is hoped that a satisfactory solution can be agreed.

The Parish Council has just received an application for seven houses on land adjoining Woods Farm Road. One of the key issues will be access from this private road onto the A417.

Planning applications under consideration

19/V2301/FUL - Riduna, Church Street. Demolition of existing building and erection of two storey replacement. Amended plans being considered by the PC.

P19/V2630/O - Land to the rear of 1 & 2 Portway Cottages. Development 2 semi-detached dwellings. The PC objected. Awaiting determination by the Vale.

P19/V3304/TDC – Monks Court, Newbury Road. Application for Technical Details Consent for one dwelling, The PC did not object following acceptance by the Conservation Officer. Awaiting determination by the Vale.

P20/V0129/RM – Mather House, White Road. Reserved matters application for the erection of 10 specialist accommodation units for older people. PC objected with concerns about appearance and landscaping, layout and access. Awaiting determination by the Vale.

P19/V3320/HH and P19/V3321/LB – Hines Cottage, Horn Lane. Re-submission of applications P19/V3320/HH and P19/V1362/LB to demolish the existing garage and substitute a garage for the approved studio/store outbuilding. The PC expressed concern about the removal of mature trees. Awaiting determination by the Vale. P20/V0389/RM - Greensands, Reading Road. Reserved Matters following outline planning permission P15/V2328/O. The PC objected to this application due to the impact on the AONB, the concentration of affordable housing, the overall housing mix, the design of the houses and lack of an acceptable travel plan. Awaiting determination by the Vale.

P20/V0784/FUL - Harwell Science and Innovation Campus Limited Partnership. Land West of Thompson Avenue. Erection of a Vaccine Manufacturing Innovation Centre, with associated landscaping and car parking. Awaiting determination by the Vale. P20/V0833/LB and P20/V1030/FUL. The Oak Room, Orchard Lane. Restoration of doorway as disabled and emergency access. The PC is considering this application.

P20/V0743/FUL - Land to the west of Thomson Avenue Harwell Campus. Erection of a multi-occupier Class B employment building, with landscaping and car parking. The PC is considering this application.

P20/V0842/O - Brightwell House Reading Road. Proposal for 7 x 3 bed detached houses. The Parish Council is considering this application.
