



Mummers - a traditional attraction



The steady beat of the drum on Boxing Day announced that the East Hendred Mummers were at the Eyston Arms and about to to perform their play. A collection on the day raised £216

for East Hendred Heritage Trust. The East Hendred play is a variant of

that of the Berkshire mummers traditionally performed up until the early 1900s by labourers and artisans.

In East Hendred, the play passed down from one father to his daughter. Rose Shailer, born 1868, the youngest of nine children, learnt the play from her father, Isaac. She married Matthew Kimber in 1887 and they raised seven boys and two girls.

In 1933 James Madison Carpenter, an American folklore collector, visited UK villages to find remnants of the mummers plays. He visited Rose Kimber and noted the characters and words she remembered of the East Hendred play.

In 2014 the Carpenter notes went online including the lost East Hendred play revived on Boxing Day 2019. On Boxing Day 2022, three new mummers took part, one of whom was a great granddaughter of Rose Kimber. We would welcome anyone with an interest in the play or in folk song and music. Message from our local County Councillor

Spring is in the air....

We've had some lasting frosts, but I have seen buds appearing, my daffodils have started to sprout and our attention turns to that period of renewal. It's been a few months of near hibernation for me and I feel like I've been reading consultation papers for the proposed reservoir at Steventon constantly. We have had several village meetings which GARD (the Group Against Reservoir Development) have kindly organised and informed us all. Please be very aware we have a huge fight on our hands. Those who live in Portway and Ridgeway Close will be able to see the proposed reservoir if it gets permission and I am sure be affected by the 10 year construction, vibration, earth movement and pollution! Please get engaged!

The County Council has prepared a response to Thames Water and the Water Resources South East Consultations which in no uncertain terms calls out the nonsense in their reports. I have been working with residents within the division (which includes Steventon), groups and councillors to ensure we are as informed as we can be of the data being presented, including writing to OFWAT to ask again for redacted data to be shown!

Of course January gave us plenty of congestion on the A417, and a combination of Thames Water, awful pothole filling and BT Openreach. My hands were numb from standing in the cold asking to speak to supervisors and calling the permit teams to find out what on earth was happening - hours spent chasing my own tail. The works outside Ridgeway Close by BT Open Reach were so poor on all levels they have been fined to date over £8,000 for the issues caused. One thing is for sure, I and my Wantage colleagues are calling for more enforcement and better management of utility companies when they come onto the highway. You however remain our eyes and ears on the ground and I've been appreciating all the messages on Facebook and WhatsApp, but kindly ask you not to message me at midnight - even I need my sleep!

The Warm Space in Snells Hall has really been a great village addition and I am forever grateful to Frances and

Mike Tristram for their continued investment of time and energy into our village. If you haven't been yet, it's every Friday from 9-4pm and now I hear there will be toddler meet-ups too and breakfast and lunch available, as well as endless tea and cake!

The HEG Larder celebrated its first anniversary in February and over 70 tonnes of food surplus saved from waste and passed to you all, I am super proud of the HEG larder team and always humbled by the time you all give to the community.

The Hendreds 20 mph speed limit has been implemented. Objections were minimal and the Parish Council and I both supported making our streets safer and more sustainable for all. There are some vehicles that really speed in the village and we need to keep East Hendred safe for all to be able to walk or cycle locally.

On April 1st my community fund reopens. This is priority funding we get as county councillors. In the past locally I've contributed towards Snells Walkway repairs and the start of the girls / women's cricket club, so come talk to me if you have any ideas you think could do with some funds this year! The pot is £15,000 and has to last two years!

Meanwhile I stay committed to voicing and championing change within politics, and transparency. As we head into another election period this May please do remember now you need Voter ID. There's lots on the government websites about this or you can always message or WhatsApp me for links. Postal votes mean that you don't have to worry, no rushing to the polling station to only find you don't have the "approved" ID available.

Of course there's a coronation and extended Bank Holiday on the horizon and I look forward to being involved in a great big village knees-up of some sort!

Until then, I might see you down the pub or wandering around the village maybe? Do stop and say hello!

It is encouraging to note the HEG Community larder is celebrating its first anniversary this month and a staggering 70 tonnes of surplus food and waste has been processed. Each week more local people come to Snells Hall to select items of food and vegetables reducing the amount of food going to landfill. The "Warm Space" in Snells Hall on Fridays is also an asset with an increasing number of people taking the opportunity to meet with friends and have a coffee or snack. A grant has been obtained from the County Council to pay for the use of Snells Hall for the Warm Space for a period and a grant was provided by the Parish Council to pay for insurance for the Community Kitchen.

The Harwell Campus is recognised as a world class research and technology centre employing over 7000 people and growing. One third of the Harwell Campus is within our parish. Harwell is keen to have a good working relationship with its neighbouring communities. An increasing number of leisure type facilities are being developed and are open to use by villagers. This includes DiSH, a dining area with music performances and an outdoor cinema (photo on page 5). Many new office and laboratory developments are also underway. The list of planning items on pages 15 of this *Bulletin* includes five current applications concerning the Harwell Campus. Members of the Council have been meeting with the Campus management team to discuss our concerns and ways in which we can work together. On planning we have mainly been concerned with loss of biodiversity, impact on the local area and on the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (the whole Campus is within the AONB) and traffic management.

The very recent introduction of the 20mph speed limit to the village is a real benefit. It was supported by the Parish Council and will help to reduce speeding in the village and the severity of injury in an accident.

It is welcome that plans are in place for the village to celebrate the King's Coronation at the beginning of May. It is almost 70 years since the village last had an opportunity to celebrate such an event and, hopefully, with good weather there will be a large turn-out for the village picnic on the Sunday.

Do come and join us at the Annual Parish Meeting in Snells Hall on April 20th. There will be a presentation on recent activities followed by workshops (as last year) where you can put forward your views and ideas on how the village can grow and develop. *John Sharp*

Planning Update

The Rowstock Residents Association supported by the Parish Council developed a strong case against the appeal to the Secretary of State against the building of a large warehousing and distribution centre on the former Esso Research Centre site at Milton Hill. Major concerns included the impact of a large number of HGV's daily on the local road network. Since the last *Bulletin* good news emerged that the appeal had been withdrawn, although the reasons for this are unclear.

The Mather House development of ten bungalows at the entrance to the village for older people is nearing completion and some are already on sale.

Members of the Council have been continuing their discussions with the Harwell Campus management on some new developments on the Campus within our parish (listed on page 15). The Council has been very concerned about a general loss of biodiversity arising

from these new developments, particularly for the proposed large Dexter development which is planned to be built on chalk grassland. The loss of biodiversity would amount to an 85% loss, to be offset by a large payment of over £200K to the Oxfordshire Trust for Environment (TOE) to fund appropriate habitat development. The Council is pressing that this development is either on the Campus or nearby(possibly in this village).

The Council has been concerned about the proposed development of the Colt Corner site on Horn Lane, replacing the existing wooden bungalow with a large house and a new entrance onto Horn Lane. The Council has objected on several grounds, particularly the size of the dwelling and its impact on neighbours. The site has existing access on its western side and the Council has objected to the unnecessary proposed new entrance on Horn Lane because of the narrow width of the lane at this point, limited sight-lines, the lack of a pavement and its use by children attending the local schools.

All Ideas Welcome !

Following a great suggestion at last year's Annual Parish Meeting, the Parish Council is delighted to have installed the suggestion box pictured right in the village shop. Many thanks to Steve and Nickie for 'hosting' the box.

Today it is home to over 200 organisations employing around 7,000 people. They range from startups to national scientific facilities and major innovation companies. and work across the space, quantum, life sciences and energy tech sectors.

Parish Church of St Augustine

It was wonderful to have so many joining us for our Christmas services at the end of last year. The coming of Jesus into the world as a small baby is everyone's favourite Christian celebration for good reasons, and it's one that has special appeal to children. My goal as rector is to make the church ever more welcoming to children and young people and their families – all year round. Don't hesitate to get in touch if you have ideas for what we could do to make this happen.

For the moment our Sunday services in East Hendred are continuing fortnightly at 11am as follows: 5 and 19 March (Mothering Sunday), 2 April (Palm Sunday), 16 and 30 April, 14 and 28 May (Whitsunday). There's a children's corner for those for whom that's relevant, and children are more than welcome to use the toys and books there or in the pews during the service. On other Sundays you are more than welcome to join the services in West Hendred at 9:30am or Ardington at 11am.

Around Easter we will have special services for Maundy Thursday, 6 April at 8pm, where we commemorate the last supper – with foot washing (participation in this is optional!) and Holy Communion. This is followed by a service on Good Friday, 7 April at 3pm, commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus; this latter service is at Holy Trinity Ardington and all are welcome. At the time of writing, the service time on Easter Day itself is to be decided. Our annual meeting to elect churchwardens and other officers is scheduled to take place on 30 April after the 11am service. The church is now also usually open to all every day from 9am to 4pm as a place for quiet contemplation or prayer.

Our famous ancient faceless clock has sadly been out of order for the last few years, but plans are now underway to restore it in time for its 500th anniversary in 2025. This project will require considerable funding, and we are hoping the whole village will come together to help make this happen and then to celebrate this remarkable anniversary in two years' time. St Mary's Catholic Church, East Hendred

At the time of writing, one could almost believe that Spring is here. It is lovely afternoons like today's that are described by the word 'Lent', referring to the lengthening of daylight and the beginning of the journey to the glory of Easter. We are still wedded to the phases of the moon, however, and this year Ash Wednesday, the beginning of 'Lent', is not until 22nd February and Easter Day 9th April. Meanwhile there are quite a few things happening: First Communion children are being prepared and the parish is preparing for significant change as my retirement comes into view. Officially I finish on 31st August but I will be taking a pre-retirement sabbatical to recharge my batteries from 1st June.

There are other changes too, recent and to come. Recently, thanks to funding received from the East Hendred Consolidated Catholic Charities, St Mary's Parish Rooms have been beautifully re-fitted, with heat pump technology, permitting economical heating in winter and air-conditioning in summer. We are hoping that, with Wi-Fi installed, this will also be another facility for the wider community. Meanwhile the heating system has failed its test at St Mary's and we are making do with a gas heater (the Burning Fiery Furnace of the Book of Daniel) until this can all be sorted out.

Things get busier once Lent begins. Details of daily services and activities are displayed on the notice-board and Lent is a marvellous opportunity for a spiritual MOT, a spring clean. There will be once again be ecumenical celebrations of Morning and Evening Prayer: 9am on Wednesdays at St Mary's, beginning on Ash Wednesday, and 5pm on Fridays at St Augustine's. For many Catholics this is the season when they find their way to Confession, either in their own church or, if they prefer, with the anonymity of the confessional in a nearby town. There will be a Quiet Morning on 1st April with extended Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday (2nd April) and the Procession of Palms from Champs Chapel at 9.30am. On Maundy Thursday (6th April) there will be Mass of the Lord's Supper at 8pm and Watch of the Passion. On Good Friday (7th April) there will be a Children's Workshop in the morning, Stations of the Cross at 12 noon, and the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord at 3pm. There will be a baptism or confirmation or two at the Easter services: the Easter Vigil at 8pm on Easter Eve (8th April) and the Solemn Mass on Easter Day. For now, we wait awhile quietly and look forward to the outburst of alleluias, worshipping the Risen Lord, the Lamb that was slain, and yet lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.





Planning Matters

P20/V1667/O - Outline application with all matters reserved for the redevelopment of part of the Harwell Campus known as Fermi Gate to provide employment floorspace for offices, laboratories and light industrial uses, temporary accommodation, parking and ancillary uses, landscaping and open space. The PC responded with a holding objection, requesting information on a Harwell Campus Masterplan, details of the of the floorspace and a travel plan. Awaiting determination.

P21/V1171/FUL – Former Esso Research Centre, Milton Hill. Application for use as a distribution centre, with access, servicing, parking, landscaping etc. The PC objected strongly to this application. Application refused by VOWH DC. The applicant appealed against the refusal to the Secretary of State. Rowstock Residents' Association, VOWH DC, the PC and Milton Hill House Hotel opposed the appeal. The appeal was withdrawn by the applicant.

P21/V3405/FUL - Mary Lyon Centre, Harwell Campus. Erection of new science and research facility with associated landscaping, car and cycle parking. Permission granted.

P22/V0416/O - Land south of Curie Avenue and west of Eighth Street. Provision of new employment floorspace, car parking and green infrastructure, comprising: Detailed planning application for Tech Edge Zone 1 and 2 and outline planning application for Tech Edge Zone 3 and 4. The PC objected as the plan was contrary to Local Plan Part 2 Core Policy CP15B on the development of Harwell Campus, Local Plan Part 1 Core Policy CP44 on Landscape and the NPPF paragraphs 174 and 176. Permission granted. P22/V1787/FUL - Harwell Science and Innovation Campus North of Thomson Avenue. Erection of employment building for office use with associated landscaping and car parking. The PC objected as the plan was contrary to CP46 of the Local Plan. Awaiting determination by the Vale.

P22/V2029/FUL - Smallholding adjacent to Bowling Alley Allotments. Proposal to provide a dog walking paddock with 1.8m high fencing and replacement of existing derelict building. The PC requested a number of amendments. Permission granted.

P22/V2282/HH and P22/V1469/LB - Pebble Cottage, Cat Street. Removal of modern wall and replace windows with french doors. The PC had no objections. Permission granted.
