Message from our County Councillor - Cllr Sally Povolotsky

Dear friends and neighbours,

Spring is finally on its way, after a soggy, stormy winter season. Seeing the snowdrops and daffodils popping up fills me with a bit more energy. At County Hall it's an interesting time. In early December I walked from the Lib Dem political group and now sit as an independent. Why? It's simple, if you want to achieve anything you need a strategy, and after years of asking, I haven't seen anything that brings benefit to our rural division, and am exhausted by an Oxford City first approach. I've battled for the last 18 months with SEND, Climate and Highways Infrastructure, trying to highlight better and more innovative ways of approaching the issues of dwindling budgets and increased demand. Over 18 months ago I raised concerns on SEND, and the evidence has proven me right. Simply, why waste positive energy for a constant negative? I'm in a much happier place and able to focus on more local issues. Politics is exhausting, and it needs to change at every single level.

SESRO (Steventon Reservoir) is rearing its head day by day, and I recently wrote to the Secretary of State to call for a Public Inquiry, as well as our MP to meet with local residents, neither has come to much fruition.

In February, I am giving evidence to the HIF1 inquiry (a new link road from Milton Park to Culham) in support, which goes against the Parishes' view who are speaking against, but we desperately need better infrastructure and we need it now. So as we head towards budgets, elections (Police Crime Commissioner and maybe a General Election) - pay attention to the small print, because you should hold people in any office to account for their actions not just their words.

Feedback from residents on the new proposals for local planning policy

It was a pleasure to see so many people at the meeting organised by East Hendred Parish Council about the Joint Local Plan consultation and to hear what you had to say, and I'd really like to thank the Parish Council for organising it. The Local Plan is an important lever for the District Council. All planning decisions must follow the local plan's policies, so it has a big impact on our area. I do hope that many of you fed back in this latest round of consultation. If not, don't worry. There will be a further consultation on the final draft.

Nature Recovery

I know that the beauty of our natural environment and landscape is really important to residents. The council hears this in feedback from residents, I hear it from

residents, and I felt it when I helped to set up Hendreds Environment Group many years ago.

With this in mind, I proposed a motion at the December meeting of Vale District Council to confirm the council's commitment to Nature Recovery and to ask the Cabinet to consider making it a priority in key council policies. This motion was unanimously supported by the council which gives a strong mandate for further action in this area.

from the chair



It is welcome news that Wicksteeds have started fitting new equipment in the Mill Lane Playground. It should be able to reopen in March. It was closed last year as some of the play equipment was considered unsafe. The new equipment will include a multi-play unit and both a basket swing as well as normal swings and it should be well used across the age range by youngsters in the village.

With the increasing interest in green issues it is encouraging to see that new planning rules were recently introduced nationwide, which require those looking to build a new development to include wildlife enhancements as part of their plans. The changes mean that developers must replace any biodiversity lost in a development, plus an additional 10 per cent by creating new habitats. It is also noteworthy that the Vale District Council has confirmed the Council's commitment to

Nature Recovery and that the Cabinet will consider making it a priority in key council policies.

We were sorry to hear of the recent death of both Ann and Ken Taylor, who were long standing village residents. Ken was a Parish Councillor for 20 years and Ann was the clerk to the Council for a period. (See below).

It is disappointing to see that the Hendreds Owls WI, which recently celebrated its 100th anniversary, will soon be put into suspension for a period as it has not so far been possible to find a President and other officers to enable it to continue. This is a real opportunity for someone new to come along and keep this long-established village organisation running for the benefit of our community. Membership of the local WI includes membership of both the County and National WIs.

Good news about the church clock being refurbished with the intention to have it operational by St. Augustine's day and fully ready to celebrate its 500th anniversary in 2025. This will be a remarkable achievement for the village, the church clock being one of the oldest in the country. We need to thank the benefactors who have provided the funds for this refurbishment. *John Sharp*

Planning Update

The Local Plan

A meeting to discuss the emerging Vale District Local Plan for 2041 was held in Snells Hall on 31st January, attended by 35 residents and Councillors. Presentations were made by John Sharp and Roger Turnbull. A Local Plan looks ahead fifteen years and plans how much development is needed in an area, like new homes, jobs, roads and schools, and where they should go. It also sets standards for environmental protection, sustainability, water quality and much more.

This Local Plan is to be made jointly between South Oxfordshire DC and the Vale of White Horse DC. The two Councils have stated that the Local Plan will add some new approaches so that more of the housing built in the Districts will be affordable, setting ambitious targets to ensure developments contribute positively to the local environment and wild life and deliver on climate action.

The timescale for the Plan is to have a working draft by Autumn 2024, submission by Spring 2025, independent

examination by Summer 2025 and acceptance by late 2025. It was pointed out that was a very ambitious timescale. The aim of the meeting was to assist the Parish Council in providing comments on the preferred options in the draft Plan by 26th February. Items discussed included houses and more development, jobs, transport and travel, need for infrastructure, power outages and water leaks and the need for a village neighbourhood plan. The focus will be to continue to build out most of the sites already planned and hence the scale of growth will be much less than the current plan.

One of the concerns raised was that the date for net zero carbon for South Oxfordshire is 2030 whereas for the Vale DC it is 2045. It was unclear how these differing targets might be accommodated in a joint plan.

Ken and Ann Taylor

Ken and Ann Taylor lived in East Hendred for over 50 years. They died early this year within a very short time of each other after long illnesses. A joint funeral was held on 20th January. Ken worked at Harwell for over 40 years until his retirement in 1992. He became a parish councillor in the early 1970's and continued as a councillor until 1983. He was directly involved with setting up the Courtesy Lighting scheme in the village and was the Parish Council representative on the Hendreds school management committee for several years. He also helped to run the Youth Club in the old village hall. Ken joined the Community Centre Committee in the 1990's and became its Treasurer in 1996. He continued in this role until he retired in 2017. Ken took a lead in setting up the computer training centre in Snells Hall after the Millennium extension was opened in 1999. He was a

very kind and considerate man, always reliable, and a key member of the village community.

Ann was active in helping to set up a village playgroup which was the precursor of the pre-school in Snells Hall. She was also a founder member of the Golden Age Club, helping to organise outings for the members. Ann and Ken were active Methodists at the time there was a chapel in Chapel Square and they ran a Sunday school which many local children attended. In later years she took a full-time post as assistant bursar at St. Mary's school in Wantage. In 1997 she became Clerk to the Parish Council – a role she held until 2006. Ann was a conscientious clerk producing accurate and timely minutes and handled correspondence effectively. She was a respected member of this village, contributing to the setting up of several organisations that continue to flourish today. We send our condolences to their daughter, Caroline.

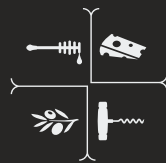
We meet at 7:30pm in term time usually at West Hendred Village Hall but our session on March 14th is in Snells Hall, East Hendred.

- Access up to £15 worth of surplus food e.g. fruit, veg and chilled goods for £3.50.
- Enjoy teas & coffees at the cafe & make new friends
- Access additional support services
- Save money on your food bills
- Membership from £3.50 per week

It's been a busy few months for the HEG Community Larder and Warm Space at Snells Hall and none of it could happen without our amazing team of volunteers.

We have around 125 larder members but we have space for more. Our capacity is 150, and you can really easily join, see the information above. Reducing Food Surplus is at our core, and in 2023 that worked out at around 400kg per member in the year, which is a huge amount of food saved from landfill or incineration.

People ask us a lot if we are a food bank or community fridge, nope, we are a Community Larder, powered by SOFEA in Didcot. You pay a weekly membership from just £3.50 and you get to take 14 items home. That can be anything from bread to ice cream, butter to crisps and more!

To help reduce waste, enjoy the surprise of what is available every week (a host of veggies guaranteed) then join us! We also have discretionary memberships for anyone who may need a little help - and this means you can join for free.

We also run the Community Hub every Monday, join us for Breakfast, Lunch or Afternoon Tea - we make meals from surplus - hot pies, quiches and pasta bakes and more! We have bacon sarnies, toast and porridge, always options, always a smile and a warm space to be. Whether you want a safe space with your toddler for a coffee break or somewhere for home work for a while (awesome WiFi), a place to catch up with friends or to knit and natter, come to the Hub. We work on a donations basis, pay what you can afford or, if not, just enjoy the warmth that's been put into the service.

The Reservoir

Group Against Reservoir Development (GARD) Update for February 2024

Thames Water finally admit that building the Reservoir will cause groundwater levels to rise by 1 metre without serious mitigation! After more than 25 years of denying any effect of the Reservoir on the local groundwater, Thames Water have only just got round to performing preliminary calculations on the actual effect. As local people have long claimed, this shows a major adverse impact on the groundwater of the area. They have no proven solution to this effect of raising the water level by 1 metre, which as residents know, will leave large areas of villages like Hanney, Steventon, Drayton, and the surrounding area underwater for months every year, even without heavy rain!

At the time of writing (9th February) the Secretary of State for DEFRA (Steve Barclay) has not made any

decision on Thames Water’s reservoir plans, or on the call for a Public Enquiry that GARD made on 20th December. So there is still time for you and our MP to influence his decision.

If you sent your complaints to Thames Water in the consultation, and you feel that they have not answered your points, or if you want to write to oppose the new, larger, project, then we urge you to follow GARD’s example and write to the Environment Agency and/or Ofwat and complain about TW’s attitude.

Parish Church of St Augustine

I was surprised one Monday morning in January to see fire engines on Newbury Road outside the Tin Hut, also known as the Rectory Room. A fault in the electrics had caused a small fire, which was quickly put out. But the damage from this means the future of the hut is now up in the air. Still, whatever happens next, it has certainly lasted long past what anyone could have expected or imagined when it was put up in 1898.

Many will have warm memories of coming to the hut for Sunday school or other activities. Fortunately, the church building itself has been made more flexible some years ago by the opening up of the south aisle. This enables us to do new things in the building like Family Church, our new service for children and adults, with stories, snacks, songs, crafts, and games. This takes place every Sunday during school term at 3:30pm, taking a break for the Easter holiday (31st March to 14th April) and summer half term

(26th May and 2nd June). Please come along sometime if you're interested.

We are extending a special welcome for people of all ages to join us at 3:30 on Mothering Sunday 10th March and on Palm Sunday 24th March. For the latter service, we hope we can tempt a real live donkey to join us for the procession. This was a great success last year in West Hendred, so I'm hoping it will become an annual tradition for this to happen somewhere in the downland villages.

Our 11am service continues on the first, third (and fifth) Sunday of each month. On Sunday 3rd March, there's a chance to meet our new Associate Vicar, Revd John Durant, and hear him preach. 31st March is Easter Day. The Parish Church Clock

High up in the tower of the parish church is a rare and ancient faceless clock. On the frame that holds it is the maker's name, John Seymour (a Wantage blacksmith), and the date 1525. For almost 500 years this clock has struck the hours and the quarters. At some point a tune wheel was added, which every three hours played the 'Angel's Hymn' by Orlando Gibbons on the bells. It was wound daily by hand, in recent years by the late Dodwell Miles and John Hill, and most recently by Phil and Martin Lawrence. The clock was overhauled by Arthur Harrison, a village blacksmith, in 1961, and kept good time until it fell silent after a part broke a few years ago.

Led by Nigel Findley, the Tower Captain, major work on the clock began in January. The work is being done by

a specialist firm, Crackstone Clocks. Many parts will need to be refurbished or replaced, and modern automatic winding and night-time silencing systems are being added. The considerable cost has already been met by generous benefactors and energetic fund-raising.

The aim is to have the clock running by Easter this year. It's hoped that the strike and chime will be operating by St Augustine's day, 26th May, and the tune wheel playing the hymn soon after, in time for the clock's 500th anniversary. The project is being fully documented to modern conservation standards, and it is hoped that soon villagers will not only be able to hear the clock tell them the hours and the quarters again, but to climb the tower and see the centuries-old mechanism at work.

As we approach another spring, I remember the advice I was given by some seasoned gardening and allotment friends when I first started out on this growing my own food malarkey.

Work on the principle of thirds, and you will never be disappointed. Thirds? Yes, one third of seeds will never grow, one third of those that do will be eaten by the wildlife and the third that are left is for you. There are always the exceptions that prove the rule. Often every seed becomes a lovely plant with nowhere for them to grow, or else, not one has managed to poke its head above the ground. I remembered the advice, gave away the excess and gratefully accepted from others who have too many.

Winter 2023 tested my resolve as I became aware that some of my brassicas were losing their lovely green leaves. Did we have pesky thieves? Well, yes, but not the 2-legged variety. As I looked at the soil around, I noticed the tell-tale sign of deer. I love the deer we have in the village and irritating as it was to lose my brassicas, I am also pleased that we have the wildlife. Not quite a third of the brassicas, more like two!

All plants want to live. Learn what they need to grow; know their preferred soil type; when and if they need

feeding; how much water they need, then let nature do the rest. I was listening to "Gardeners Question Time" and a chap asked about rotation as he didn't bother. Was it necessary? Knowing which plant will benefit from the nutrients left from last year's crop or those which hate what has gone before will greatly assist cropping. In fact, plants can benefit from being grown next to each other in one season. A little research along these lines will save time, money and maximise the crop.

Finally, remember the insects that we need. This year, I plan to research which flowers will help increase the beneficial insects and pollinators on my allotment. I can only say it worked last year in my garden on my plum tree which was infested with tiny white insects – someone said that it was an ant farm and sure enough I had a large ant colony at its base. I bought ladybirds and the transformation was astonishing! Happily, a few days ago I found ladybirds hibernating ready to help me again this spring.

If you don't have an allotment, you can grow in your garden or in pots on the patio, or on a sunny windowsill. Somehow it all tastes so much better when you have grown it yourself. Happy Growing 2024. *Lyn Mason*

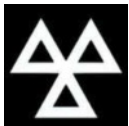

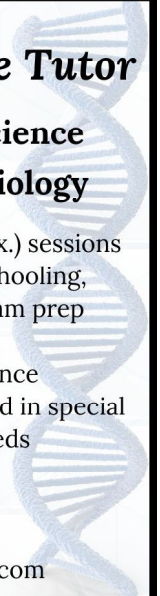

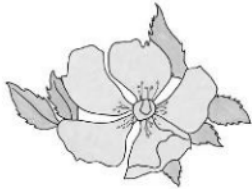
